### SMALL TREES -15-25 Feet

<u>Eastern Redbud</u>	Cercis canadensis
<u>Corneliancherry Dogwood</u>	Cornus mas 'Golden Glory'
<u>Ann Magnolia</u>	Magnolia 'Ann'
<u>Butterflies Magnolia</u>	Magnolia 'Butterflies'
<u>Leonard Messel Magnolia</u>	Magnolia xloebneri 'Leonard Messel'
<u>Star Magnolia</u>	Magnolia stellata
<u>Japanese Tree Lilac</u>	Syringa reticulata
<u>Pekin Lilac</u>	Syringa pekinensis 'China Snow'
<u>Thornless Hawthorn</u>	Crataegus crus-galli var. inermis
<u>Blackhaw Viburnum</u>	Viburnum prunifolium (single trunk)

### CRABAPPLES – Malus spp (disease resistance cultivars)

#### **WHITE FLOWERS**

- 'Adirondack' – 19'x 10', upright, green leaves, ½" bright red fruit
- 'Donald Wyman' – 20' x 25', rounded, green leaves Bright red persistent fruit.
- 'Harvest Gold' – 20'x 25', upright, dark green leaves, Pink buds, ½ golden fruit.
- 'Lancelot' – 10'x 8', oval, dark green leaves, red buds, 3/8" gold persistent fruit
- 'Sargentii' – 8' x 15', spreading, dark green leaves, 1/3" dark red profuse fruit
- 'Sugar Tyme' – 18' x 15', oval, pink buds, profuse flowers, ½" bronze fruit

#### **PINK FLOWERS**

- 'Candy mint' – 10' x 15', spreading, rose flowers, bronze/green leaves, ¼" red fruit
- 'Louisa' – 15' x 15', weeping, glossy green leaves, pink flowers, 3/8" yellow fruit,
- 'Coralburst' – 15' x 15', weeping, glossy green leaves, pink flowers, ½" bronze fruit.

#### **RED FLOWERS**

- 'Adams' – 20' x 20', rounded, red flowers, leaves with red tint, 5/8" red fruit, orange-red fall color
- 'Centurion' – 20' x 25', upright, red/purple, green leaves, 5/8" red persistent fruit
- 'Profusion' – 20' x 20', upright/spreading, purple/bronze leaves, ½" maroon fruit.

### MEDIUM-SIZED TREES 25-40 FOOT

<u>Bur Oak</u>	Quercus macrocarpa
